Waddow Lodge is our May visit



Our May meeting is an afternoon trip to Waddow Lodge Garden in Waddington, near Clitheroe.

The gardens around this Georgian property have been transformed by Peter Foley, who ran Holden Clough nursery for over 30 years, and Liz Dean to create a plantsman's garden full of interesting and unusual plants.

Set in the beautiful Ribble Valley the garden is host to hundreds of plants collected over the

past 40 years. These include herbaceous perennials, grasses, old fashioned and modern roses and shrubs, heathers and rhododendrons, dwarf conifers and alpines.

There are also shade-loving perennials and bulbs along with fruit and vegetables in a new kitchen garden area.

In addition a small orchard of classic old apple varieties, many native to Yorkshire and Lancashire, is being established as a small wildflower area. A wet meadow further down the garden now boasts a new pond and stream with wild flowers and to encourage wildlife into the garden.

Make your own way there on Thursday, 17 May. There will be a small entry charge which goes to charity. Check our website for details nearer the time.
